THE APPLICATION PROCESS

The criteria for admission to ULI are that students must be 15 years of age or older, full-time students must apply to study for a minimum of 2 consecutive sessions (4 months), students must submit all required documents in a timely manner, and students must fulfill all the requirements of the application process. Please send the following documents to apply (please see application form for more details):

1. Completed application form
2. Non-refundable application fee of \$75
3. Current financial documents
4. Grade transcripts from previous school
5. Copy of passport
6. Immunization form

After being accepted, ULI will send students all documents necessary to apply for a student visa (if applicable).

Student visa applicants must be accepted a month or more before the placement test. New students are required to enroll and register on or before the day of the scheduled placement test. New student orientation will be at 9:00 a.m. on the Friday following the placement test.

WHAT ULI PROVIDES

- 6 levels of English from beginning to advanced,
- 25 hours of class per week. 7 weeks of class per session with new classes beginning every 8 weeks

INFORMATION ABOUT FINANCES



All prices are subject to change without notice. ULI accepts cash; check, money order, traveler's check payable to University Language Institute; bank transfer; cash transfer from Western Union; and debit or credit card (paid in person or online only). All tuition and fees are due on or before the first day of class each session. Fees not paid by the 5th day after classes begin will have a 10% fee added to the unpaid balance. Students who haven't paid by Wednesday of Week 2 will be de-enrolled from classes. Tuition refunds based on school/class withdrawal are available only during the first 2 weeks of class as follows: 100% before the first day of class, 80% during the first 5 days of class, and 70% during the second 5 days of class.

MEDICAL INSURANCE

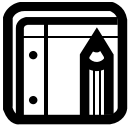
ULI requires all full-time students to have medical insurance. ULI can help students and their families purchase medical insurance. If a student already has medical insurance that can be used in the United States, he/she must have proof of that insurance. If the student has US citizenship, permanent residency, or asylum, the student must provide their own insurance.

ULI CLASS POLICIES

ATTENDANCE



ULI classes meet Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and from 1:00 p.m. to 2:50 p.m. To comply with immigration regulations, students with an F-1 student visa must attend class for 4-5 hours each day, 5 days per week, for a total of 25 hours per week.

Students will lose 5% points from the final grade for each unexcused absence after 4 absences. Students who are de-enrolled for non-payment or non-attendance (and not re-enrolled) will have their I-20s terminated in SEVIS.

ENGLISH ONLY

Students are requested to use only English during and between classes.

CHAPEL

ULI is a Christian school. All students are required to attend ULI chapel services once a week on Wednesday. Many types of English skills are practiced in chapel.



BEHAVIOR

Smoking and drinking alcohol is not permitted at ULI or during field trips.

CLOTHING

Please wear neat and modest clothing to class. Men and women may wear a nice shirt with nice pants or jeans. Women may wear modest skirts or dresses. Very short pants, skirts, and dresses are not allowed.

WEATHER



Summer weather in Tulsa is very hot and humid. Summer months are July, August, and September. Autumn is in October and is slightly chilly but pleasant. Winters are cold and windy, often with snow. Winter months are November, December, January, and February. Spring months are mild and pleasant and are usually in March, April, May, and June.

The monthly cost includes the following (unless otherwise indicated):

- Room (student is responsible for keeping clean)
- Bathroom (may share with a family member or guests)
- Meals (American breakfast, sack lunch, and evening meal)
- Transportation between school and home

APARTMENTS

Students under the age of 18 cannot rent an apartment without an adult. There are several apartments within walking distance of ULI. However, the best ones require car or bus transportation. Most apartment communities require their renters to sign a lease of 6 or 7 months. A few allow 3-month leases. Most apartments will require the first and last months' rent to be paid before moving in.
